US and Iran Tensions Rise Amid Possible Talks in Islamabad

US-Iran Talks in Islamabad

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USPA NEWS - The 2026 conflict between Iran and the United States marks one of the most serious escalations in decades of tension between the two nations. The war began on February 28, 2026, when U.S. and allied forces launched large-scale strikes targeting Iran's military infrastructure, leadership, and nuclear-related facilities. This escalation followed years of disputes over Iran's nuclear program, regional influence, and the collapse of diplomatic agreements such as the 2015 nuclear deal. In response, Iran carried out retaliatory missile and drone attacks against U.S. bases, allied countries, and strategic oil routes across the Middle East. The conflict quickly expanded beyond direct confrontation, involving regional actors and threatening global energy supplies, particularly through disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz. The war has caused significant casualties, economic instability, and disruptions to global trade and travel. While recent reports indicate attempts at diplomatic negotiations and temporary pauses in strikes, the situation remains highly unstable. This conflict reflects long-standing geopolitical tensions rooted in historical mistrust, power struggles in the Middle East

The relationship between Iran and the United States has been difficult for many years. The two countries once had a normal relationship, but over time, trust broke down. Today, they are often in conflict because of politics, military issues, and Iran's nuclear program. This has made the situation in the Middle East more unstable.

One big reason for the conflict is history. In 1979, the Iranian Revolution changed the country's government. After that, relations with the United States became much worse. The hostage crisis in Tehran also made things more serious. Since then, both countries have seen each other as enemies in many ways.

Another major issue is Iran's nuclear program. The United States and other countries worry that Iran might try to build nuclear weapons. Iran says its nuclear program is for peaceful use. This disagreement has caused many negotiations, but also many problems. At times, the two sides have made agreements, but those agreements have often broken down later. Sanctions are also part of the conflict. The United States has used economic sanctions to pressure Iran. These sanctions have affected Iran's economy and made daily life harder for many people.
